Anarchist – people who oppose all organized government

**bootlegger** – someone who sold illegal alcohol during Prohibition

**collective bargaining** – process in which employers negotiate with labor unions about hours, wages, and other working conditions

**Communism** – is an economic and political system in which the state owns the means of production and a single party rules

**Dawes Plan** – loan program to help Germany make reparations to England and France so that those countries could repay wartime loans to the United States

**Disarmament** - the reduction or limitation of military armaments

Fair Labor Standards Act – law that set a minimum wage and a maximum workweek and outlawed child labor

**flapper** – a young woman of the 1920s who rejected traditional values and dress

**Great Migration** - movement of 6 million African Americans out of the rural Southern United States to the urban Northeast, Midwest, and West that occurred between 1916 and 1970.

Harlem Renaissance – the flowering of African American arts and literature in 1920s New York

**installment buying** – buying on credit by making an initial down payment and then paying the balance over time

- Rising stock prices attracted many new investors

Kellogg-Briand Pact – 1928 agreement to outlaw war as an instrument of national policy
