#### BOX 1

Taking on the characteristics of the American society and discontinuing previous culture or heritage.

Act that excluded Chinese immigrants from becoming laborers in the USA by not allowing Chinese immigrants in who could not read and write their own language.

When a company controls most of all business in a particular industry. Example: Standard Oil Company

A group of corporations run by single board of directors.

### BOX 2

Labor Union that only allows skilled workers, led by Samuel Gompers and used collective bargaining.

When a union negotiates with management for all of the workers as a whole, for better pay and working conditions.

Group of citizens who sought to perverse the USA for native born American citizens and argued that immigrants couldn't assimilate due to language, religion and custom barriers.

Housing where the buildings are divided into many tiny apartments and are often referred to as slums.

### BOX 3

A person who opposes all forms of government.

Law that required children attend school up to a certain age for a certain amount of time every year.

These people were Southern and Eastern Europe and had little experience with Democracy or cities. Usually catholic or Jewish from Italy, Poland, Russia, & Greece.

The rapid growth of the city populations usually connected to the introduction of a new foreign population and the movement of people from rural to urban centers.

### BOX 5

Someone who sets up a new business to make a profit.

A manufacturing method in which a product is put together as it moves along a belt.

Used mainly by automotive industry.

A document giving someone the sole right to make and sell an invention

### BOX 4

A person or group of people who move from China and Japan the United States

Types of businesses that are owned by many investors.

These people were usually Protestants from Northern and Western Europe who mostly spoke English and had experience in Democracy.

### BOX 6

The process of becoming part of another culture.

The system in which privately owned businesses compete freely.

This welfare program was created by Jane Addams as a way to offer help to the urban poor, and worked to improve conditions for men women and children.


### BOX 7
